The Nicene Creed

We pray for our world. On this anniversary weekend we remember those killed on 9/11, and in the wars it led to. For those who live with their memories, and their injuries, every day. For the peoples of Afghanistan, and so many other areas of oppression and violence. For war zones where generations have been blighted by hatred and violence. For areas where the changing climate is making it almost impossible to survive. For men, women and children who are trying to escape from starvation and violence – and find that no one wants

them. Lord in your mercy: hear our prayer.

We pray for our own country. Where the pandemic has seen the number of food banks increase – and the number of people who are billionaires has increased as well. A country where some have huge wealth, and for others a benefit cut of £20 will mean hunger. Forgive us Lord that we have lost our way, that our Christian values are ignored. May we, somehow, turn back to you. Lord in your mercy: hear our prayer.

We pray for our families and our friends. For those we are especially concerned about, we name them before you. We remember friends who have died, and we hold them in our love and our prayers. We bring our prayers together as we pray the prayer that Jesus taught us:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name: thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.
