The Summary of the Law

Loving God, we pray for peace among nations, peace in our communities and peace in our hearts. We pray for those caught up in tragedy and disaster. We pray at this time for healing in all places where there is

violence, war and terrorism. We particularly think about the crisis in Ukraine and for whose lives have been thrown into turmoil. We ask for all those who are in positions of power to strive for what is right and influence decisions to end the suffering of the innocent. We pray for your power, your light and hope to help those affected find a safe passage to sanctuary. Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer.

Father God, sometimes our days are so full of worries that we forget how many blessings we have. When our worries spiral out of control, help us to turn them into a conversation with you, confident that you will calm our anxiety and give us hope for the future. We thank you for the joy of sharing kindness and human love. We thank you for our family and friends. We pray particularly for loved ones who worry us with their health or circumstances or life direction. We pray for those among our friends and families who do not know you, or whose faith has been shaken. We give thanks for the friendship, love and support each one of us receives from our church community. Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer.

God of compassion, Jesus went out to the people and brought healing and love, not just with his words but also with his touch. We bring before you all those who are suffering in mind, body or spirit. We pray for those who are unwell and for all those who care for them. Sustain their faith and hope. Renew their spirits with your presence and gracious love. Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer.

Father God, we pray for the departed and for all who mourn their loss. We remember today our own friends and family members who we still miss and treasure. Help us to listen and offer support to those who feel alone or anxious in their grief. Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer.

Finally, Lord, we ask for your courage and guidance, to find the right path, however difficult it may seem to tread, and however we are tested. May we humbly follow Jesus, to live a devoted life of faith and true Christian service. Give us grace and understanding, trusting in your promises, that your established, eternal kingdom of heaven will be open to us, now and always.

Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer.

We bring our prayers together as we pray the prayer that Jesus taught us:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name: thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.
