## Remembering Tom Hughes - Remembrance Sunday 2021







1941, flying instructor at Shawbury in Shropshire, flying Airspeed Oxford





Posted to Gibraltar in 1943, flying Spitfires built in England and shipped out. Then to North Africa. On 2 March 1943 engine failed behind enemy lines - he had a 20 mile walk to get home.



15 August 1943, took over Comiso airfield in Sicily. The Germans had left one Messerschmidt which was flyable - until it caught fire. Tom had to parachute - the only member of the

RAF to get his silkworm badge jumping out of a Messerschmidt!





Battle of Monte Cassino - a four month battle in which 250,000 died. Tom was shot down in flames on 17 December 1943. Transferred to Winenden Hospital as a PoW. After a year he was taken to Switzerland - 3000 Germans swapped for 1000 British. Back to Cambridge after the War, met Joan, a PE teacher - "I can only love you if you love flying". She did! May they rest in peace and rise in glory.
