Prayers of Intercession

Wisdom has built her house, she has hewn her seven pillars. She calls 'Come, eat of my bread and drink of the wine I have mixed. Lay aside immaturity, and live, and walk in the way of insight.'

Lord, the way of insight seems so blurred. As we look at the situation in Afghanistan – where the desire to leave seems to have hidden the reality of what will happen. We cannot understand the wisdom of the Taliban, their beliefs and way of life. We cannot imagine what the future will be, especially for women and girls. We pray for all those trying to make peace, trying to build a peaceful future – and we pray for those who are desperate to escape, afraid for their lives, wondering how they will survive.

Lord, in your mercy, **Hear our prayer.**

Wisdom seems hidden as our world responds to the changing climate. For decades we have been told that humans need to change, that our economy and life has to be constructed in a different way, that we cannot expect to consume so many resources. Yet we have not listened. We have not listened because the changes will affect us, they may well mean we cannot live as easily or travel as much – we know the challenges of a sustainable world, but we do not want to heed them. Grant us wisdom, grant our leaders wisdom, bring the nations and the peoples of the world together – Lord, may we make the changes necessary so our world can survive in all its beauty and life. Lord, in your mercy, **Hear our prayer.**

In Plymouth we have seen how wisdom can be destroyed by false doctrine. Beliefs that apparently are based on hatred, anger, evil, fear – beliefs that can lead to destruction and death. We pray for individuals whose beliefs and actions are evil – and we know Lord how deeply that evil is rooted. Our Society has turned away from its Christian heritage, its Christian faith, the vacuum is being filled by different beliefs, many of which we believe are not based on your love. We pray for all as we counter such hatred, as we proclaim your Gospel. But we give thanks too, the light is not defeated. For the wisdom, the planning, the dedication, the goodness we saw in our emergency services, in our hospitals, in local government, in a community that comes together. We pray for the churches of that City, for men and women of good will – the light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has never put it out. Lord, in your mercy, **Hear our prayer.**

We pray for the life of our churches – for our two churches, our Diocese, Bishops Libby and Malcolm, for our friends in Allestree Churches Together, and our friends in the Nagpur churches. We give thanks for the support we were able to give them in yesterday's Book Sale, and the joy of being social again. We pray for our

families as we come together for a picnic this afternoon. For Blake and Natalie as they are married this afternoon, for Max and Helen next Saturday – Lord, grant them your love and wisdom we ask in their continuing journey. We pray for friends who are unwell, for all for whom we are concerned about. We remember our friend John Gear, giving thanks for his ministry and dedication to you, for his wisdom and faith, for Christine and the family – bless them we ask, bless us as we mourn. Lord, in your mercy, **Hear our prayer.**

We bring our prayers together as we pray the prayer that Jesus taught us:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name: thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.
