## The Summary of the Law

Our Lord Jesus Christ said: The first commandment is this: 'Hear, O Israel, the Lord our God is the only Lord. You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength.'

The second is this: 'Love your neighbour as yourself.' There is no other commandment greater than these. On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets.

### The Nicene Creed

We ask that through our faith in you, our hearts are willing to be led and guided by your truth and your holy spirit within us. Help us to abandon past things that do not honour you. Life is full of so many temptations but we ask that by allowing you, rather than the world to set our values and our lifestyles we can turn our living around. We give thanks that You dear Lord are the God of mercy and forgiveness, you will never abandon us and are always near to those who call out to you. As we live and work and look to life in our local communities, help us to be thankful for your blessings and aware of your love and the effect it has on us. May our service and the sacrifices we make in our lives make us the beacon of faith and light that enables your face to shine out from within us. May our actions and our deeds inspire others to call upon your name too. Lord, in your mercy, **hear our prayer.**

We give thanks for our local communities and for all the signs of care, concern and love that have been made manifest in them over the past difficult year. We give thanks for the heartening effects of brighter, longer days, for the burgeoning of nature in the spring days, and we pledge ourselves afresh to play our part in the building up of God's Kingdom. Lord, in your mercy, **hear our prayer.**

And we pray, as Jesus taught us:

**Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name: thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.**
