The Summary of the Law

The Nicene Creed

Prayers of Intercession

Lord God, thank you for the gift of this season of Lent. Thank you for knowing our hearts and our need for rhythms in our lives, and for drawing us into a deeper communion with you throughout the coming 40 days. We are finding it tough trying to keep Lent while our television plays out scenes of War – so we pray first for our brothers and sisters in Ukraine. We cannot imagine what they are going through, and what it must be like to read these bible passages in the middle of conflict when the devil is in your midst. We hold them in our love. Lord, in your mercy, **hear our prayer.**

Lord, it can be disheartening to remind ourselves that we all come from dust, and to dust we shall return, indeed this year it is even more painful than normal. Yet we know that there is more to our stories. We know that you created man and woman from the dust at the very beginning of time and that you breathed life into them to transform them into living creatures. We know that you made a covenant with Noah, with Abraham, with Moses, with David, that you journeyed with your people. We know you are in the business of

resurrection - your very Son went to the cross to show us that no death is final and that ultimate transformation comes through your gift of salvation. Though we are made from dust, and our bodies will return to dust again, we can live in eternal glory with you through the blood of your Son.

We pray for this dark world. We know that pain and suffering, disease and death, are a reality for so many – the numbers of those who have died with Covid are unimaginable, and each number is a person, loved and cherished. The numbers of those who have died in Ukraine are unimaginable, and each number is a person, loved and cherished. We pray for those who continue to give so much, to work so hard, to face so much suffering – Lord, strengthen them we ask. We pray for those who cope with their illness, and the illness of those they love. For all who cannot hold hands, share a hug, kiss their beloved. For all who are refugees, separated from the people they love. We name before you people for whom we are especially concerned. We pray for friends locally. Lord in your mercy, **Hear our prayer.**

We pray for the life of the church. May we walk through this season intentionally, removing distractions that take our gaze away from your glory. May we quiet the noise that pulls us from adoration of you and puts our attention on lesser things. May we simplify where we have been stressed, may we surrender what has been burdensome, may we repent of what has been sinful. Once again this Lent we cannot share Lent Lunches with our friends from Allestree Churches Together – we pray for each other, for our churches, for those in Nagpur, the communities we support. Help us, Lord, to see how our links go forward.
Lord in your mercy, **Hear our prayer.**

May we see your goodness and your glory in new ways throughout this season of Lent. We pray for our homes, our families and friends – for those we miss so much. We thank you for the ways we are able to keep in touch, and ask that, as the days grow longer, we might rejoice in this Spring. As we all journey to Easter, may we know the depths of your love for us more fully. May we feel the pain you endured for our sake, Jesus, and may we rejoice that you conquered every bit of evil when you rose to life again.

We give thanks that Lent leads to Easter. We pray for those who have died, those we miss so much. Lord, we thank you for the glimpses of glory you give us in this life, for your friendship and your promise to be with us always. We bring our prayers together as we pray the prayer that Jesus taught us:

And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.
