The Nicene Creed

And so we ask that when times are hard, you guide us all through our darkest and weakest moments. We pray for each one of us as we struggle in body, mind and spirit. Give us the assurance of your blessings and your grace we pray Lord when we call out to you in times of need. We keep in our prayers especially those who are known to us. Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer.

Finally merciful God, we ask that you give courage and faith to those who are bereaved. We ask that by casting their cares upon you, they may find strength to face the days ahead. We give our thanks for the lives of the dearly departed and we pray that they are now risen to a new life and are at rest and peace with you in your eternal kingdom.

We bring our prayers together as we pray the prayer that Jesus taught us:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name: thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil.
